Bulk Waste

Tenants are responsible for their bulk waste. Any bulk waste just left outside without contacting Camden Council will not be collected. This will cause the estate to look untidy and risk vermin and pest infestation. Camden Council offer a service to residents where they collect furniture/white goods that are unsuitable for reuse costs are as follows:

- 1-5 items (or up to 20 black bags) - £25.00
- 6-10 items (or up to 40 black bags) - £50.00
- 11-15 items (or up to 60 black bags) £75.00

Senior citizens and those in receipt of income support are eligible for two free collections per year.

If you are buying a new appliance, please check with your retailer to see if they can take back your old machine.

Camden Council also work in partnership with the ReStore Community Project to collect and reuse domestic furniture for the benefit of people in need. They will collect furniture such as:

Report a crime or anti-social behaviour

You can report a crime or anti-social behaviour by calling the police, or Crimestoppers if you want to remain anonymous.

You should Call 999 if you or someone else is in immediate danger, or if the crime is in progress or call 101 to contact the police if the crime is not an emergency.

You can also contact Crimestoppers to report a crime anonymously. They will pass the information about the crime to the police. You can report a crime to Crimestoppers by visiting their website www.crimestoppers-uk.org or by calling 0800 555 111.

You can help keep Camden clean by organising or taking part in a community clean-up. Camden would like you to join in on the crackdown of littering, dog fouling and fly-tipping as part of the Clean Camden Campaign.

Since the campaign began in November 2013 Camden have been able to achieve the following:

- Handed out over 900 fixed penalty notices of £80 each to people dropping cigarette butts and other litter.
- Successfully prosecuted offenders at Highbury Corner Magistrates' Court, with those convicted being fined up to £225 plus costs.
- Reduced the number of black unmarked bags of waste being dumped across the borough from Hampstead Town to Bloomsbury.
- Held events with police and community wardens to raise awareness about the tough approach we are taking to dog fouling.

Get involved

The money Camden have received from these activities is now being reinvested in community clean-ups, and they now are asking residents and community groups to get involved.

A number of events have been organised across the borough, including litter picking, creating community gardens and tackling dog fouling, and they are looking for volunteers to take part and organise events in other areas.

Look out for posters in your local area letting you know about a clean-up event where you live. If there isn't one near you, why not organise one yourself?

Litter pickers and gloves are provided, as well as some innovative approaches to reducing dog fouling. They'll also provide posters to publicise your event.
